Avelo Airlines Takes Flight From Bradley International Airport With New Nonstop Service to Dominican Republic

Windsor Locks, CONN. – Feb. 21, 2025 – The Connecticut Airport Authority is pleased to announce that Avelo Airlines officially launched its third international nonstop route from Bradley International Airport (BDL) to the Caribbean today with service to Punta Cana International Airport (PUJ) in the Dominican Republic. The inaugural flight departed this morning and will operate year-round, twice a week – on Mondays and Fridays.
